

Summary

The narrator of this story can't recall the death of his father that happened when he was only a year and a half. He didn't see the extermination of thousands of followers and activists of the Unión Patriótica during the 80's and 90's either. One day, however, his thesis director reveals something that forces him to face the ghosts from a past that is - at the same time- personal and collective. He gives him details about his father's murder that obsesses him and take him to the hamletian dilemma between representation and revenge (or both). When the narrator finds out his father's assassin is alive and there are reliable clues about his location, the doubt becomes more real than ever. The route he follows, from Bogotá to Madrid, is a double search: his own consolation and to have the voice of a generation that didn't have the direct experience of those facts, but is still living the consequences by themselves and has to decide among a new attempt of peace or the blind commitment to violence.



of many of these images, and of moments relived.






CAJÓN DE SASTRE

Summary

Camas gemelas is the first novel by the writer Paola Caballero Daza (Cartagena, 1975). It is a brave narration about depression and suicide, with some allusion to racism in the Colombian context, exploring their existential dimensions. The novel is built on the relationship between two siblings, Negro and Nena, through remembrances of their childhood and adolescence bouncing from vital memories —the beach, laughter, music— to the grim ones -sickness, racism, and violence. The characters dive into each other and become a reflection of their complex being and desires, generating an intimacy both liberating and melancholic. Through an honest poetic view, the author puts together a subtle emotional landscape in which the light of sadness glows. This novel narrates the impossibility of grief and the ambivalent exploration of wounds; it may definitely be read as a treatise of melancholy.

Paola Caballero Daza (Cartagena, 1975) | Is a writer, cultural worker and director of the residency program Guion bajo. She studied Literature at the Universidad de los Andes, and an MA in Asian and African studies from the Colegio de México, as well as a course in Expanded Writing: Language, Science and Art of the Cátedra José Emilio Pachecho from the UNAM. Grandpa Kima Baiji, a famous healer, is witched and becomes ill. And It turns out that he does not know how to heal himself. Even so, he has to leave his maloca (house) to bring food to the rubber factory where his tribe is forced to work, deep in the Amazon jungle. In his way, he meets 'Tizi', the Skeleton-Man, a fearsome and powerful spirit who, in exchange for a bit of mambe and ambil, heals him and also reveals the secret to a good hunt. Entering his dreams, Tizi warns him that he must not catch more than five partridges each night; otherwise a misfortune might befall Grandpa. Written by Fernando Urbina Rangel, an expert in Amazonian mythology and indigenous art, this book is based on a story by José García, one of the wisest of the Muinane people. In these pages we find indigenous thought, customs, beliefs and, with more emphasis, their relationship with the spirits of nature, on which the balance of life depends. The story takes place at the time of the rubber plantations, whose exploitation and slavery system almost wiped out the ethnic groups that inhabit the Colombian-Peruvian Amazon, between the Caquetá River and the Putumayo River. Illustrated by the artist Santiago Cubides, this book includes an illustration index that will allow the reader to discover the meaning of the elements present in the vivid images, made in colored pencils, that accompany the story.

Fernando Urbina Rangel (Pamplona, 1939) | He obtained a degree in Philosophy from the National University of Colombia in 1963 and from that same year he taught at that institution until 2004. Researcher of Archaic Thought (mythology and cave art), Professor Urbina has carried out 40 field works among indigenous communities, is the author of eight books and innumerable articles that have been published in books and academic journals. Fernando is also a photographer and poet. His photos around indigenous cultures have been exhibited in more than 26 individual exhibitions. With his poetry, also inspired by indigenous culture and mythology, he has participated in numerous recitals on radio and television. He received the Medal of Merit from the National University of Colombia in 1995, and the Alfonso López Pumarejo Award in 2012, from the same University,

for his scientific and academic merits.

Summary

According to the tradition of the U'wa people, those children who born with malformations must die. Berichá was born without legs, but her parents, who had lost five children, decided to raise her. Years later, the girl was left in the care of a Catholic boarding school, as her father had died and her mother could not support her. Since the first days in there, 'Esperanza Aguablanca', as she was called, stood out for her charisma and lucidity. In "My feet are on my head", Berichá tells us about her childhood among priests and nuns and how she later returned to the land of her grandparents in the Sierra Nevada del Cocuy, where she took up ancestral customs and knowledge. In defense of the culture and territory of the original peoples, she would become one of the first indigenous leaders in the country. Through these pages, Berichá also leads us to discover the u'wa universe: its myths; their rituals around birth, planting and hunting; the role of the 'uejéná' as mediators between the people and the spirits of the Earth; and a coherent system of thought and behavior in which abundance and health depend on a good relationship with nature. This book is part of the Library of Colombian Writers, an initiative of the Ministry of Culture of Colombia that reunites a series of notable works from female writers in the last two hundred years.

Author's biography



Esperanza Aguablanca (Berichá) 1944-1999 | She was born in Cubará, in the high lands of Boyacá. The missionaries of the Catholic boarding school where she spent part of her childhood and adolescence gave her the name 'Esperanza Aguablanca'. Years later she became a school teacher and, by rescuing the culture and territories of her ancestors, she also became one of the first indigenous leaders in Colombia. She had a degree in Philology and Languages from the Universidad Libre de Cúcuta and a master's degree in Ethnolinguistics of Aboriginal Languages from the Universidad de los Andes. In addition, she received the Cafam Award for Women in 1993, as well as other recognitions from the Mayor's Office of the city of Bogotá and the Governor's of Norte de Santander.

Colombia: A brief history

Summary

For many years, Colombia's history has been focused on its chronic armed conflicts and the brutal war against drug trafficking, offering a one-sided picture of the nation. The author offers multiple data points about the economic, social, cultural and historical characteristics of the nation that show Colombia as a prosperous land whose diversity sets it apart. Colombia is a country of 48 million people, located in the northern part of South America with access to the Pacific and Atlantic oceans. It also features several climatic zones that facilitate diverse crops and fauna, contain an important forest reserve (including a significant portion of the Amazon rainforest), three mountain ranges that are part of the Andean chain, and multiple rivers that serve as a major means of transportation and subsistence for the Colombian people. This introductory information is just the tip of the iceberg of all there is to discover about this rich and varied land and its hemispheric and global importance. This volume also tells the story of Colombia from the first inhabitants to the present day, covering the Colony, Independence, the creation of the Republic, the political ups and downs of the 19th century and the first half of the 20th century, the brutal civil war known as the Violence, the sea changes at the end of the last century and the challenges of the new one. In 2010, he landed for the first time on that frozen land, supported by NASA and United States National Science Foundation (NSF), to launch into the stratosphere a robotic telescope propelled by a helium balloon to look at the origin of the stars. This is his story and that of the adventurers that reached for what has been called the last place on Earth.







Muysca: Numbers, myths and rock art

Summary

The book is a way to get to know the numbers of the Muysca Lunar Calendar that friar José Domingo Duquesne recovered in 1790. It explains that the first five numbers indicate the mythical time of Creation and the five cardinal points. It also exposes the function and the value of numerical symbols, proposing a correspondence with the order of the gods and of the myths, the Muysca design and the rock art of the Cundiboyacense territory, in Colombia. While preparing for this book, I discover that the cosmogonic numbers are born from the facial organs of the Moon-goddess, Owner of Time. I indicate the epiphany of the Frog goddess, emblem of the Calendar, proposing that this cosmogony is aquatic and lunar.
